By the end of this ebook, you will have a basic understanding of conversing in French and know some of the most common French phrases.

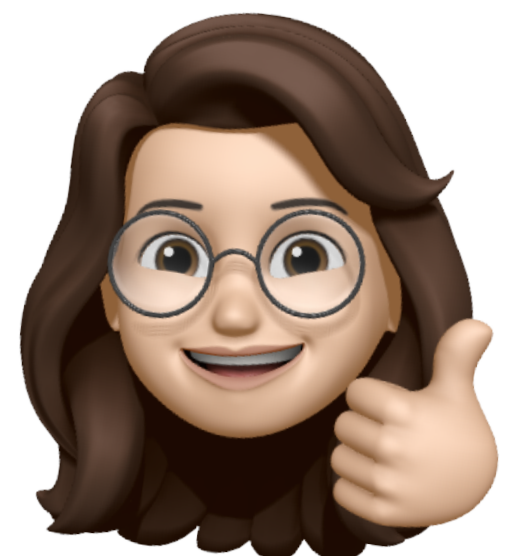
## ***Who is this ebook for?***

Surround yourself with the French language as much as possible. Listen to French music, watch French movies or TV shows, and try to incorporate French into your daily life.



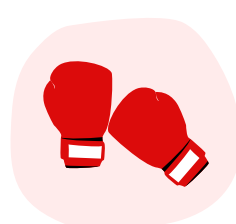
### **Take a Course:**

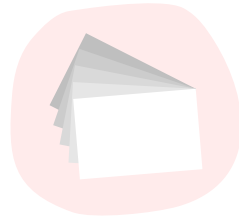
### **Read in French:**
